### NOMINATION AND APPLICATION

**Times:** Nomination deadline for our partner universities is April 1 for the fall semester and October 1 for the spring semester.

Once the nomination period is completed students will be invited to complete an online registration form to finalize their application.

## ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The Academic Year at SSE is divided into two semesters, a fall semester, and a spring semester. Each semester is divided into two teaching periods, where periods one and two are placed in fall and periods three and four into the spring semester. Exchange students can only apply to semesters not periods, however if you have students that are interested in only coming for one period please contact the Exchange Office.

For incoming exchange students the semester starts a couple of days earlier with a mandatory introduction to SSE, Stockholm and Sweden. For Fall Semester 2025 the Orientation Day will be on August 22, for Spring Semester 2026 it will be on January 16 (dates are subject to change).

Examination dates can be found in the academic calendar and are typically placed at the end of each teaching period.

## ACADEMIC INFORMATION

**Language requirements:** All courses are given in English, it is the home university's responsibility to ensure that students are capable of following classes given in English.

**Course Format:** Typically on site and in person. Exchange students are requested to stay until the end of their scheduled exams. No special early exams can be arranged. Arrival can be made up to 2 weeks after the beginning of the first course.

The course registration will be open between May 6 – May 20 for the fall semester and TBD for the spring semester. These dates are subject to change, and will be updated in the academic calendar.

**Workload:** Exchange students are able to take courses corresponding to 30 ECTS; i.e. 15 ECTS per teaching period, this typically amounts to two courses per teaching period.

**Transcripts:** Transcripts are available 2 months after the final exams. Student are invited to download their transcript directly on the internal portal. An original copy can be sent by post upon request.

## PRACTICAL INFORMATION

**Housing:** At SSE we have a small housing office that offers rooms and apartments to some of our international students. There is no guarantee for housing, we recommend you to check other possibilities for accommodation. You can find more information [here](#)

**Cost of Living:** The following is a feasible monthly budget.

Housing: 5,000–9,000 SEK

Food: 3,000 SEK

Insurance: 300 SEK

Hobbies: 2,000 SEK

Local Transportation: 650 SEK

Telephone and internet: 300 SEK

**Visa:** Depending on your country of origin, you might need a residence permit to come to SSE. Please, refer to the [Swedish Migration Agency's](#) website to read what applies to your specific case.

**Insurance:** It is very important that you purchase a travel insurance that covers your trip and ensure that you have valid medical insurance covering your whole stay in Sweden. EU/EEA students should make sure they bring a [European Health Insurance Card](#) from their home countries or, alternatively, bring the terms and conditions for a fully comprehensive private health insurance policy.
