# How SHoF Research Was Used to Evaluate Sweden's COVID-19 Tax Deferrals



To ease liquidity shortfalls during the pandemic, Sweden allowed businesses to defer employer contributions, payroll taxes, and VAT. The Swedish National Audit Office evaluated the policy's

effectiveness, relying on SHoF [research](#) by **Gustav Martinsson** and **Christian Thomann** on government-backed credit interventions. Martinsson also served as the report's reference expert.
